Our paint colors are specifically chosen for our residents. *Not* for some designer home or magazine.

Other than the brain, the eye is the most complex organ. Alzheimer's and dementia residents have trouble differentiating colors and space, and need brighter colors to help identify spaces as well as navigate them. Our team specifically chose colors that will enhance the living experience, and make it easy to move from one area to another with ease. While it might not be our taste, or yours, it's exactly what they need to enhance their daily activity, eating habits, and moderate their mood.

Peach stimulates the appetite (our hydration rooms) Blue is a restful color with a calming effect (resident rooms). Research suggest the use of blue in the physical environment can actually lower blood pressure. It has also been shown that the blue (green) rooms are perceived several degrees cooler than rooms painted in warm shades. Green is associated with growth and life, and is the most restful of colors. Green reduces central nervous system activity and helps people feel calm. Yellow is highly visible color - makes rooms appear larger - and is good for small rooms where you want a restful atmosphere.



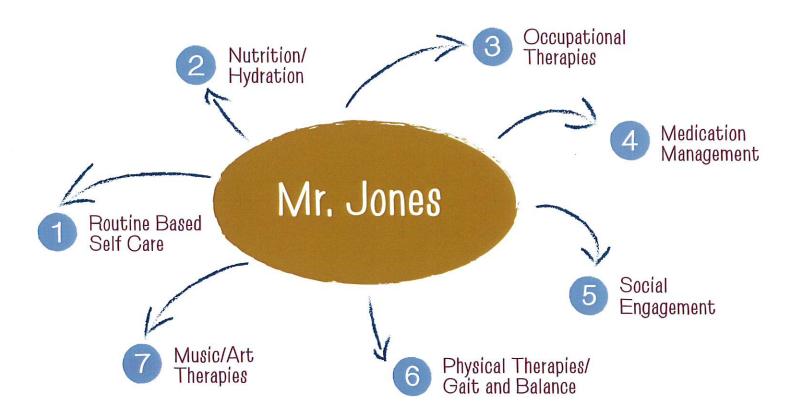








Memory Care of Simpsonville Personalized Service Plan

Dehydration can be life threatening:



Unfortunately, memory care residents have many factors that increase their risk of dehydration. Typically, older generations have a decreased thirst drive, making them less likely to recognize thirst. Additionally, many medications can increase the risk of dehydration.

Perhaps most importantly, residents with memory loss often cannot communicate thirst!

Hydrating our residents is top priority. Hydration stations are strategically placed in the

building to promote drinking. Resident fluid consumption is top of mind for all our staff and they are continually encouraging daily fluid consumption for our residents.



A Memory Care of Simpsonville original innovation: the motion-sensored lighted handrail!

A part of our goal to reduce the number of falls, we created a motion-sensored lighted hand that will help residents navigate a direct path from the bed to the toilet securely during the night. The motion-sensored light provides instant visual directions, without overwhelming the resident's eyesight. The handrail natu-

rally provides security and support, resulting in the most safe and secure pathway. Couple this innovation with our barn-style sliding door and non-skid flooring – our residents have the best opportunity to stay safe.
